### OUR APPROACH

Our off-campus elective Bible classes offer public high school students in Georgia the opportunity to encounter Jesus while acquiring academic credit. These life-changing courses help students become Christian leaders in their communities and go out into the nations.

Our teachers inspire and mentor young leaders in a classroom setting through:

- Innovative learning techniques
- A welcoming environment, where students feel safe to explore their faith or to question the claims of Christianity
- Theologically rich content, yet practical and easy to understand
- Helping students discover how to live a holistic spiritual life

Our desire is to provide every metro-Atlanta public high school student with an opportunity to experience the message of Jesus during the school day in a way that is relevant and non-threatening. We equip youth outside the church walls, right where they are.

### **OUR IMPACT**

Students spend one hour a day, five days per week, in CORE Foundations classes. It would take almost four years of Sunday School or small groups to equal what we do in one year!

#### **OUR VISION:**

By 2030, our vision is to offer a CORE Foundations class at all 96 Metro-Atlanta public high schools - giving us the potential to mentor over 4,000 students each year as Christian leaders.

#### 2015 - 2016 EXPANSION

- Atlanta City Schools: These inner city schools are eager for CORE classes and prime targets for developing youth as future leaders. We've begun preparation of the classroom for Booker T. Washington High School and are on track to launch this class by Fall 2016.
- Pulton County Schools: Multiple Fulton schools have already requested CORE classes, and growing community excitement is opening the door to more of the county's 16 high schools. The South Fulton (Tri-Cities) program, scheduled to launch in January 2016, is in a critical, low-income area.
- Paulding County Schools: As the second fastest growing county in Georgia, we're eager to establish our classes in Paulding County, where they desire to commit to a long-term partnership with CORE. Our first class is set to begin in Fall 2016, with high potential to expand to an additional five high schools in the future.

For \$20,000 per school, a new CORE class can be established and disciple at least 24 students per year.
